

Ascent to Jerusalem

- **Luke 19:28**
And after He had said these things, He was going on ahead, ascending to Jerusalem.
- **Luke 9:51**
And it came about, when the days were approaching for His ascension, that He resolutely set His face to go to Jerusalem;



The Mount of Olives

- **Luke 19:29, 30**
And it came about that when He approached Bethphage and Bethany, near the mount that is called Olivet, He sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village opposite you, in which as you enter you will find a colt tied, on which no one yet has ever sat; untie it, and bring it here."

Prophecy Fulfilled

■ **Zechariah 9:9**

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout in triumph, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; He is just and endowed with salvation, Humble, and mounted on a donkey, Even on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

The Term "Tie" in Prophecy


■ **Genesis 49:10, 11**

"The scepter shall not depart from Judah, Nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, Until Shiloh comes, And to him shall be the obedience of the peoples. He ties his foal to the vine, And his donkey's colt to the choice vine; He washes his garments in wine, And his robes in the blood of grapes."

■ **Luke 19:31, 32**


"And if anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' thus shall you speak, 'The Lord has need of it.'" And those who were sent went away and found it just as He had told them.



The Disciples Obey

■ **Luke 19:33, 34**


And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying the colt?" And they said, "The Lord has need of it."



A Royal King and Humble Servant

■ **Luke 19:35, 36**


And they brought it to Jesus, and they threw their garments on the colt, and put Jesus on it. And as He was going, they were spreading their garments in the road.



The king will reign in heaven


■ **Luke 19:37, 38**

And as He was now approaching, near the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the miracles which they had seen, saying, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord; Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

 A Prophetic Psalm of Ascent


■ **Psalm 118:22, 25, 26**

 The Unbelief of the Jewish Leaders


■ **Luke 19:39, 40**

 Jesus' Lament over Jerusalem


■ **Luke 19:41, 42**

And when He approached, He saw the city and wept over it, saying, "If you had known in this day, even you, the things which make for peace! But now they have been hidden from your eyes."

 Jesus Predicts Judgment


■ **Luke 19:43, 44**

“For the days shall come upon you when your enemies will throw up a bank before you, and surround you, and hem you in on every side, and will level you to the ground and your children within you, and they will not leave in you one stone upon another, because you did not recognize the time of your visitation.”

 A Previous Lament in Luke

■ **Luke 13:34, 35**

“O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, just as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you would not have it! Behold, your house is left to you desolate; and I say to you, you shall not see Me until the time comes when you say, ‘Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!’”

Repent therefore and return, that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord; and that He may send Jesus, the Christ appointed for you,

Now Lord, You are releasing Your bond-servant to depart in peace, According to Your word; For my eyes have seen Your salvation, Which You have prepared in the presence of all peoples . . .

1) God's visitation means either salvation or judgment

■ **Luke 2:32, 34, 35**

A Light of revelation to the Gentiles, And the glory of Your people Israel. . . . And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary His mother, "Behold, this Child is appointed for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and for a sign to be opposed and a sword will pierce even your own soul to the end that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed."

1) God's visitation means either salvation or judgment

■ **John 3:36**

"He who believes in the Son has eternal life; but he who does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him."

2) To have peace one must embrace the Prince of Peace

■ **Luke 2:14** (NIV)

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests."
